"A Word from the Pastor"

Becoming a Praying Church

Charles Bridges, preacher and theologian in the Church of England in the 19th century, said, "Take one step at a time, every step under Divine warrant and direction. Ever plan for yourself in simple



dependence on God. It is nothing less than self-idolatry to conceive that we can carry on even the ordinary matters of the day without his counsel. He loves to be consulted. Therefore take all thy difficulties to be resolved by Him. Be in the habit of going to Him in the first place — before self-will, self-pleasing, self-wisdom, human friends, convenience, expediency. Before any of these have been consulted go to God at once. Consider no circumstances too clear to need his direction. In all thy ways, small as well as great; in all thy concerns, personal or relative, temporal or eternal, let Him be supreme." His wisdom speaks volumes for us as individuals and church!

When the Lord Jesus was praying at his baptism, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him (Luke 3:21-22). Jesus spent the night praying to God before he chose his twelve disciples (Luke 6:12). Throughout his earthly ministry, Jesus made a habit of praying in a quiet place (Luke 22:39). In Gethsemane, he prayed, "Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me, yet not my will, but yours be done (Luke 22:42)." Jesus' disciples joined together constantly in prayer (Acts 1:14) and were baptized with the Holy Spirit, through whose power and presence the Church was established and expanded in an amazing way (Acts 2:1-47). The Apostle Paul says, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)."

Richland Next cannot be carried on and accomplished unless we become a praying church and pray without ceasing. Let us pray as individuals and church, taking one step at a time, every step under the Lord's guidance and direction. Let us keep moving forward prayerfully with small steps that we can take and in simple dependence on God. We are confident that He who began a good work in us will carry it on to completion in His time and in His way. Let us become a praying church, allowing the Lord to do in a way that only He can do!


George to the Rescue! (Again)
